Academic roles in journal publishing

EDITING AND COORDINATION

For many journals, the editorial team will be academics.

Being an editor has reputational advantages, but tasks are not part of the formal academic workload and the role is not usually remunerated.



PEER REVIEW

Each paper is sent to 2 - 3 academics for peer review.

Academics provide peer review regularly, and each review takes several hours. This work is voluntary and completed in an academic's own time. It is performed to support colleagues and is not remunerated.



EDITORIAL TASKS

- Organising special issues
- Soliciting submissions
- Coordinating peer review
- Deciding what to publish
- Communicating with authors e.g. about copyright clearance
- Editing and formatting articles

PUBLICATION

The publisher formats, publishes and distributes the journal and advertises / promotes journal content.

* Publishers increasingly use AI for these tasks.


